## School Fund

For the rest of the school, we ask that children pay a £1 donation for non-uniform days. This will help towards keeping costs of visits to no more than £5. Thank you.

A number of parents have also asked if older brothers/sisters can collect at the end of the school day. We would ask that any older brother or sister collecting should be Year 9 or above.
