

Reporting symptoms after the school closes for Christmas Holidays

Dear Parents and Carers

The Grove Primary School will close on December 18th. If your child develops symptoms of coronavirus, you must book a test.

If your child develops symptoms up to and including December 20th which result in a positive test up to 24th December, you must inform the school at <u>enquiries@thegroveprimaryschool.co.uk</u> Please note this will be checked daily between 9am and 10am up until 24th December and then again from 1st January. The school mobile will be unavailable so you must contact school via email.

Please include the name of your child, their class and the date that their symptoms started, as well as your own contact details.

From Monday 21st December

If your child develops coronavirus symptoms from Monday 21st December onwards, they must be tested and, if positive, follow the advice of Test and Trace. You do not need to inform the school of any symptoms which occur after this date.

<u>Attendance</u>

Remember that it is important that your child attends school as often as possible. If your child is not in school, they are missing out on vital learning.

If your child is sick/unwell or has an appointment, you must contact the school office.

If a child has to take a coronavirus test, we would ask that these are emailed to the school email address <u>enquiries@thegroveprimaryschool.co.uk</u>

Entitled to Free School Meals?

If you think your child might be entitled to Free School Meals, please contact the school office and the ladies will be able to check for you. This also applies to those children in Nursery although children do not stay for a school meal we could receive additional funding to support your child.

This also applies to children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. All children are entitled to a free school lunch but a check could mean we receive additional funding for your child to support them at school.

We hope to use this money to be able to help with food parcels in January- as well - which is always a tough month for everyone.

We also received some wonderful hampers including food, toiletries and small gifts from St. John's Church, in Castleside, which were beautifully presented and brought to school. We have been able to help over 20 families so far and 50 children have benefited - ages range from a few months up to 17 years.

We have had positive feedback from our families and are so pleased to be able to help in this way there's no way we could do it without the help of the wider community - so thank you!
