Dear Parents/Carers

I cannot believe that another half term has passed us by and what a busy one it has been as well. It has been another lockdown but not like the previous one as you have managed to get to grips with Tapestry and home learning. You have shared the role as teachers with your child's class teacher and you have all done an amazing job. Some of you have children of various ages and I know that it has not been easy getting to grips with Tapestry for all of your family. We will continue with our remote learning offer from Tuesday 23rd February as Monday 22nd is a Professional Development (PD) day for staff. School will be closed on this day. Staff will set screen free activities on this day for our families.

Staff have also adjusted to another new way of teaching and as they always do continue to go above and beyond for our families. We are missing all of our families and staff have enjoyed speaking to parents and families over the phone and keeping in touch via Tapestry too.

We remain responsible for accounting for every child's learning, attendance and welfare, even while we are in lockdown. Therefore, we have developed ways to communicate, teach and monitor every child and support them through this period. We have had some difficulty contacting families and would ask that you answer/respond to phone calls made from our school number as soon as possible please.

Tapestry Update- Parents not accessing Tapestry

This lockdown is very different from last time and there is an expectation that families participate in remote learning. This time, however, schools were given specific instruction on the expectations for 'remote attendance' and 'remote learning':

Schools must continue to complete the attendance register for pupils who are receiving remote education... Schools should keep a record of, and monitor pupils' and students' engagement with remote education, but this does not need to be tracked in the attendance register."

Our offer for home learning (remote learning) is through Tapestry where your child will access their daily activities and upload evidence of their work too (please see http://www.thegroveprimaryschool.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/sites/69/2021/01/Remote-Learning-Guidelines.pdf for Remote Learning guidance). Your child/ren must access the activities set by staff as this will create a 'learning journal' for your child and an evidence base of what they have accessed during lockdown. As yet, your child has very little or no documents in their journal and we may be asked to submit those family names/journals of those not accessing home (remote) learning. This would be the same way if during normal circumstances that a child is not attending school.

We can offer laptops to support children accessing work and we can also provide modems for those with limited/no internet access at home. We can even talk you through the process of accessing and uploading work to your child's journal. Please get in touch if we can support in any way at all.
