### Updated advice from Durham County Council

A summary message for parents and carers which reflects the most recent government guidance when there is a case in the household is provided below:

### What to do if there is a case of coronavirus (COVID-19) in your household?

It is strongly advised to increased testing when there is a positive COVID-19 case in your household:

- PCR testing for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case in their household\*.
- Daily LFT testing at home for 7 days for any adult and also for all children aged 5 years and over who are exempt from isolation and continue to attend school. The testing of primary age pupils is at parental discretion. Testing should start from the day the household member has symptoms or if they don't have symptoms from when they tested positive\*.

\*Note: People who have tested positive with a PCR test within the last 90 days should not be encouraged to test unless they develop new symptoms

#### <u>Attendance</u>

Remember that it is important that your child attends school as often as possible. If your child is not in school, they are missing out on vital learning.

If your child is sick/unwell or has an appointment, you must contact the school office.

If a child has to take a coronavirus test, we would ask that these are emailed to the school email address <u>enquiries@thegroveprimaryschool.co.uk</u>

### Entitled to Free School Meals?

If you think your child might be entitled to Free School Meals, please contact the school office and the ladies will be able to check for you. This also applies to those children in Nursery although children do not stay for a school meal we could receive additional funding to support your child.

This also applies to children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. All children are entitled to a free school lunch but a check could mean we receive additional funding for your child to support them at school.
