Punctuality

Nursery children (morning + 30 hours) and siblings should arrive promptly at 8.30am before the register closes at 8.35am. The gate will then be open to all other children from 8.35am. All other children must arrive in time for the register closing at 8.50am.

If your child is late, they will receive a L code. If a child arrives after 9.05am, this will be recorded as a U and will affect the percentage recorded on your child's report. We know that there are unexpected events that may cause families to be late but we would ask all of our families to arrive on time as far as possible.

Next week events... Year 2 SATs

Year 2 will have their SATs next week. Children will take these as part of the school day so will not need to attend school any earlier than usual but all children will be entitled to a free breakfast this week! Pupils can arrive between 8-8.10am via the pupil entrance.

School Photographer

The school photographer will visit school on Wednesday 24th May. The photographer will take class photos in the school. If your child attends Afternoon Nursery, they can arrive at the hall doors- at 9am- to have their photograph taken. For all other classes photographs will be taken during the school day.

Year 4 Visit to Whitley Bay

On Monday 22nd May 2023, Year 4 will be having a trip to our local coast at Whitley Bay, looking for signs of erosion, different ways the coastline is made up and how humans have shaped the landscape. They will need the following things for school that day:

comfortable shoes, a coat, a backpack to store all their things in, packed lunch (unless being provided for by school), water bottle, non-uniform suitable for a trip to the coast, a FULL change of clothes and shoes, a towel (hopefully we get on to the beach) and Sun lotion.

We will be going whatever the weather, so children need to be prepared for every eventuality. Hopefully, the weather will be kind and the children can have some time playing and exploring the beach. They can also bring some pocket money (no more than £5) that they can spend. As part of our class treat- this term- that the children save their pennies for, they can earn the chance to have free time on the beach.
