Punctuality

Children from Reception to Year 6 can enter through the gates between 8.35-8.50am (Nursery children and their families at 8.30am). During this time, staff arrange small intervention groups, hear individual children read, or allow children to access handwriting activities or maths activities to support them in lessons. The earlier the children arrive the more benefit they receive from these sessions.

Please remember that the gate closes promptly at 8.50am and children arriving after this time will receive a 'L' code.

Any child arriving after 9.10am will receive a 'U' code.

We want to work with families to ensure that children attend as much as they can because if children are not in school then they cannot learn.

Please remember that we are here to help and support.

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance, then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

Attendance Letters

We have shared an attendance letter with some families today where children are less than 92%. We will carefully monitor attendance until half term and would hope to see an improvement. If you feel that your family needs support, to improve attendance, we would ask you to make an appointment to discuss this as soon as possible.

Traffic along Oakfield Lane

We are continuing to work with our PCSO and would like to remind parents/carers and anyone else dropping children off at our school.

- We kindly ask that parents and carers dropping off and collecting follow the one- way system to alleviate congestion.
- We also ask that cars do not park opposite the school gates so children and families can cross safely.
- We would also ask that you park safely and allow children to get out onto the pavement rather than dropping them off in the middle of the road.
- Parents/carers should adhere to the staggered timings when dropping off (only 8.30am for Nursery and their siblings) and 8.35-8.50am for all other children.
- Please also consider your speed as you drive along Oakfield Lane.
- Lastly, we would ask that parents do not sit for long periods of time, along Oakfield Lane, with their engines running waiting to collect children.

Thank you for your continued support and making drop off and collection times safer; it is certainly improving!
